Tourism campaign videos to showcase the Upper Lachlan Shire



New videos that form part of a local Tourism campaign will soon be available on the Visit Upper Lachlan website thanks to Destination Southern NSW and funding from the Bushfire Local Recovery Economy Fund.

Council's Manager of Tourism and Economic Development Christiane Cocum said that the campaign and videos were created for three Council's impacted by the 2019/2020 Bushfires.

"Upper Lachlan was featured in three of the five trails that were filmed & designed to take people on planned road trips across our region. Goulburn

Mulwaree and Queanbeyan Palerang feature as well," she said. "The videos will be featured under Road Trips on the Visit NSW site which is a real marketing coup for us, as it will provide major exposure nationally and internationally as the Road Trips are a highly visited part of Visit NSW."

As part of the filming, numerous small businesses and natural assets along the trails were featured, showcasing our Shire in this incredible footage and featuring many residents of the Shire.

"I'd like to thank those businesses who took part," Ms Cocum said.

"It was great to see some local Upper Lachlan Shire residents including a young family and young couple involved, who scored a paid acting gig for the day in the process!"

"It was a fun and special experience and great for all involved to be a part of, and more than that, will do a great job of promoting the Upper Lachlan Shire."

Resilience Blueprint Survey extended to end of June

The Resilience Blueprint Survey launched by the Canberra Region Joint Organisation (CRJO) in conjunction with the Australian and NSW Governments in May 2022 has been extended.

Strong support for the Resilient Blueprint project across the region – as evidenced by the contributions and feedback from workshops, briefings and drop in session participants – has encouraged the CRJO to extend the survey.

“The Resilience Survey has been extended to 1 July 2022,” said Upper Lachlan Shire Council general manager Colleen Worthy.

“CRJO have received some amazing feedback and feel that we’re just starting to get the ball rolling.”

The purpose of the survey was, especially for those directly impacted by fires and other disasters across the region, to acknowledge the need to do things differently in response to climate change.

Following analysis it was clear new tools and ways of working together were needed to undertake the actions required to prepare for and prevent the impacts of disasters and to recover and rebuild in more resilient ways.

The Resilience Blueprint project facilitates councils and communities across the region to better prevent, prepare, respond and recover from future disasters and challenges. The vision is for individuals, families, communities and organisations to confidently navigate a changing world.

The survey seeks to learn from the experience of those who have lived through the disasters and to integrate some of that knowledge and experience into Resilience precautions, protocols and actions.

It will provide tools and resources to integrate resilience thinking into day-to-day decisions, build skills through training and deliver high value regionally significant resilience projects.



“The Canberra Region Joint Organisation is creating the Blueprint for a Resilient South East in partnership with councils, community, emergency and resilience specialists, and state and federal agencies, Mrs Worthy said.

“Delivered through local government, the project works with national and state government, emergency services, researchers, businesses and communities to embed resilience in decision making.

“The range and scale of disasters and changes to our climate means we need new partnerships between government and community, with clear roles and responsibilities for prevention and preparedness.”

Mrs Worthy urged people to complete the short survey to assist in the development of a blueprint that includes the experience and suggestions of those who have endured disasters.

Briefs from Ordinary Council Meeting - 16 June 2022

Apologies

There were no apologies. Cllr Lauren Woodbridge participated via video conference.

Mayoral Minute

Council received and noted the activities attended by the Mayor in the period since the last Monthly Ordinary Meeting of Council.

Nature Strips and Trees Policy

Council deferred a decision on the Draft Nature Strips and Trees Policy.

Review of Upper Lachlan Shire Council Waste Transfer Station Operations

Council resolved to cease acceptance of bulky waste items at the Taralga, Gunning, Collector, Bigga and Tuena Waste Transfer Centres except on two amnesty days each year. Bulky waste items on those amnesty days to be limited to no more than two cubic metres per household. Household/ residential waste, recycling, and scrap metal will be the only waste types accepted at the Taralga, Gunning, Collector, Bigga and Tuena Waste Transfer Centres with the exception of the two amnesty days per year. Council will review costings in 12 months and investigate idea of a re-use facility for the Shire. Council will continue to accept bulky waste items at Crookwell Waste Transfer Centre.

Road closure and sale of land in Grabben Gullen adjacent to Grabben Gullen Creek Lot 1 DP 1016457, Lot 64 and 136 DP 754115

Council resolve to close and sell the unused road through Lot 1 DP 1016457 and Lots 64 DP 754114 and Lot 136 DP 754115. Council will advertise the road closure and proposed sale for a period of 21 days and will sell the closed road to adjoining land owners (P and M Lannan) for the price stated in Crown land valuation.

Post Exhibition – Draft DCP Dog and Cat Boarding and Breeding Chapter

Council resolved to note the submissions received during the public exhibition period and provide a response to all submissions. Council adopted the revised draft DCP Chapter and authorised Council Officers to complete all actions to amend Council's DCP and repeal the former Chapter with a notice of Council's decision placed on Council's website within 28 days of the resolution to adopt the plan. Where adopted, the notice shall include a statement that the plan comes into effect on the date the notice of Council's decision is placed on the website.

Update on Cooks Hill Road Upgrade – Tilt Renewables and Rye Park Wind Farm

Council acknowledged that there have been unforeseen delays in the completion of the upgrading of Cooks Hill Road to a bitumen surface related to biodiversity issues and the condition

of the existing drainage structures. Council agreed to delayed completion of the Cooks Hill Road upgrade from Stage 3 to Stage 4 of the Road Upgrade Program of the Rye Park Wind Farm Staging Report dated November 2021.

Council resolved that a legal Deed of Agreement be undertaken by Council with Tilt Renewables formalising the scope of works for Cooks Hill Road upgrading and the program for road sealing is to be completed by 30 November 2022. Upper Lachlan Shire residents along Cooks Hill Road will be notified of the proposed works along the road and the indicative construction timetable.

Council, in accordance with the Integrated Planning and Reporting Guidelines and requirements of Section 402 and Sections 8A-8C, of the Local Government Act 1993, adopted the Upper Lachlan Community Strategic Plan Towards 2042 and resolved to provide a response to all public submissions to the Community Strategic Plan Towards 2042.

Integrated Planning and Reporting – adoption of 2022/2023 Council Plans

Council, in accordance with Sections 8A-8C and Sections 403-406, of the Local Government Act 1993 adopted the following Strategic Plans:-
