ETHICAL DECISION MAKING AND CONFLICTS OF INTEREST

A GUIDING CHECKLIST FOR COUNCILLORS, OFFICERS AND COMMUNITY COMMITTEES

ETHICAL DECISION MAKING

- Is the decision or conduct legal?
- Is it consistent with Government policy, Council's objectives and Code of Conduct?
- What will the outcome be for you, your colleagues, the Council, anyone else?
- Does it raise a conflict of interest?
- Could your possible conflict of interest lead to private gain or loss at public expense?
- Can the decision be justified in terms of public interest?
- Would it withstand public scrutiny?

CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- A conflict of interest is a clash between private interest and public duty. There are two types of conflict:
 1. Pecuniary – regulated by the *Local Government Act* and Department of Local Government and,
 2. Non-pecuniary – regulated by Codes of Conduct and policy, ICAC, Ombudsman, Department of Local Government (advice only).

THE TEST FOR CONFLICT OF INTEREST

- Is it likely I could be influenced by personal interest in carrying out my public duty?
- Would a fair and reasonable person believe I could be so influenced?
- Conflict of interest is closely tied to the layperson's definition of "corruption" – using public office for private gain.
- Important to consider public perceptions of whether you have a conflict of interest.

IDENTIFYING PROBLEMS

- 1st Do I have private interest affected by a matter I am officially involved in?
- 2nd Is my official role one of influence or perceived influence over the matter?
- 3rd Do my private interest conflict with my official role?

Whilst seeking advice is generally useful, the ultimate decision rests with the person concerned.

PRIMARY PRODUCTION SUBDIVISIONS

 - Evidence that demonstrates that the size, shape and location of the lots are suitable for primary production purposes and that the size of the proposed lot/s will be consistent with the size of lots used for primary production immediately surrounding the proposed subdivision;
 - The demand for the lots and the need for the subdivision to facilitate farm adjustments including the transfer of farming land. This may include evidence of agreement to purchase the land by existing primary producers;
 - Whether the lots created will support a new agricultural practice, rural industry or permitted employment generating industry;
 - Whether financial assessment (e.g. business plan) of the subdivision is needed to support ongoing primary production;
 - The location of, and the need for additional infrastructure, water and other factors that would facilitate primary production being carried out on the lots;
 - When the primary production activity is to commence;
 - Whether the proposed subdivision will result in the fragmentation of rural lands including creating lots separated from adjoining or adjacent lands under different ownership by a public Council road, will isolate fertile agricultural land, will

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prevent access to existing water supply including creeks, rivers, dams or bores and/or reduce existing water supply entitlements/licenses;

- The nature of surrounding land uses including location of existing dwelling houses to ensure the proposed subdivision will not create potential for land use conflicts; and
- Whether the land will be used according to sustainable land management practices.

Discussion Paper

Why does the federal Government give citizenship to people who bring over 1 million \$?
Why do councils use rate payer money to encourage investment?
Why has the state government stopped our council from offering the market what it wants?
The Market wants "life style farms" not 100Ha Farms.
100Ha is too big for a hobby Farm and too small for a Farm.
Quite happy to spend tax payer money for "Jobs and growth" where they live.
We lose our industry and are blocked from developing what is a vibrant market.

Once again small acreage is in demand. It peaked in 2001 2002 and then due to the larger supply of small acreage blocks created prior to the closing down of concessional blocks and the 100 acres subdivision the demand evaporated. Subdivisions sat unsold and the market halved.

Again we are going into a period where I believe we will see small acreage ramping up to 800k to 1 million. The drivers are, the incredible boom in the Sydney market, the internet connecting us with the world immediately, our booming population growth and contraction of supply of small acreage.

Many councils are anxious to capture this market. Yass council has altered its rules regarding small acreage and Wollondilly is already dominated by small farms. It is doubtful if there are more than 10 holding of more than 1000 Ha in the Wollondilly shire.

The Yass Shire has realised the employment and investment bought in by hobby farms. They have that critical resource, "off farm income".

Once again the prime use of the land changes. Agriculture moves west. We are in undeclared competition with other shires. No one wants to have their primary utilisation removed and nothing to replace it.

The Upper Lachlan Shire Council is quite unique and if given the opportunity to compete for the Tree Change market have many unrecognised advantages over Yass, Southern Highlands and all of Rural NSW.

I speak about the Taralga Plateau and Crookwell high country. It has some of the best soils in NSW and relative to the rest of NSW, reliable high rainfall. It is cold country.

Unlike most of NSW our area was a major contributor to the Soldier Settler Blocks. This was a gift by the government to those who had served in the Great War. The blocks that were given were less than a living area and those who took them up found it a struggle.

Certainly in the Taralga there are very few large holdings. In the main the farmers managing their farms are well into their 60's. Children are never encouraged to return to the farm as it is such a battle. The farms are valued at such a high price that a positive yield of 1% is considered reasonable. If money is needed to service bank loans or required for living expenses the fencing, weed control and pasture improvement is not done. We let our asset run down because we know that what we have is a finite asset, in a stable economy close to our largest city and the Nations capital. One day the market will come to us. While the Council has the power to enforce weed control this is not always easy. There are social issues and enforcement would be costly and potentially very difficult when the subject of an enforcement order went to the press. With this approach how many opportunities will we miss.

Our Council is fortunate in that it has few "white elephants" and no major financial disasters to fund. Being a rural Council to the benefit of the rate payers (predominately rural) our councillors have "stuck to their knitting". We are in a sound financial position. For that we must thank the councillors of recent years.

I believe we are at a "tipping Point" and with opportunity ; timing is everything.

The Upper Lachlan quality country requires owners with off farm income. Many of these farms have got to be reclaimed and improved. The growth of Goulburn in recent years has been without precedent. Many of those coming have sold out of the Sydney market and have the money to plant trees, improve pasture and attend to weeds and fences. With the rapid growth of the internet social and business opportunity are now available in a way they have never been before. They have the financial capacity to improve their holding and as such create a capital profit. It is this market that Yass is attracting and what Wollondilly already has.

I am very involved in sporting horses. In its entirety it is a large industry. It is also a high value added industry. Our country is ideal for horses being cold country and as such ,much more healthy for horses. Unlike the Wollondilly Shire it is not too late for 4000 acre plus properties to be acquired. It is this size and larger that can support a small labor force.

The Hunter has conflict with the mines, but the mines yields per Ha is far higher than any rural endeavour. The Hunter is a victim of Global Warming. The coast is not nearly as healthy for livestock as the inland. Young cattle are taken west of the divide to fatten.

The Goulburn Race Course is the closest non coastal Race Course to Sydney. If we could build a horse industry on the Taralga Plateau so many opportunities would emerge.

Smart Councils give markets they want. One hundred Hectares is way too much country for a tree changer but not big enough to support a full time worker. There are different structures that could satisfy the agricultural land management such as community title. But if these holdings can only provide one house per 100 ha the property cant justify the investment. It is the value of the residential houses that make it work. Approvals under our current rules restrict the residential value of the land and thus the available money to invest substantially in the buildings and land.

Lets be careful that we don't "fall between two stools "

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The petition to improve the pedestrian crossing across Goulburn St, adjacent to the IGA supermarket.

During the past year, both staff and management at Crookwell IGA have been made increasingly aware of the growing public concern regarding the safety of the pedestrian crossing which crosses Goulburn St, adjacent to the IGA entrance doors. Everyone, it seems has a near miss story, whether as a driver or a pedestrian and it is the feeling of the public, that it is only a matter of time before someone is seriously injured or killed as a result of the poor safety standards on this crossing.

Recently, staff at both Davies Newsagency and Crookwell IGA, asked customers and members of the public to voice and endorse their concerns by signing a petition, supporting their fears and grave concerns about the safety standards of the pedestrian crossing.

A total of 1500+ signatures in one weekend, were gathered on this petition and recorded in favour of a safety upgrade to the crossing. The response was overwhelming. It is fair to say that people, whether local or visitor, in Crookwell, are extremely concerned about public safety on and around this pedestrian crossing.

Everyone, it seems has a story of a near miss and this is certainly supported by the staff working the front checkouts in the IGA, who regularly witness either a pedestrian or a driver, involved in an almost catastrophic incident.

Many of the comments alluded to the issue that the pedestrian crossing is not obvious to visitors, who are obviously unfamiliar with the streetscape, and many do not even see the crossing in the process of looking for a car parking space in the main shopping area.

Whilst it is not the purpose of this letter to be prescriptive about the nature of future upgrades, members of the public who signed the petition expressed a desire to see better lighting, signage and a wombat style raised crossing to make it more visible to both drivers and pedestrians alike.

The petition was presented to Mayor Brian McCormack on Wednesday 28/3/2018 with the intentions of it being discussed at next council meeting Thursday 19/4/2018. Members of the public realise that this is not the first public petition regarding the pedestrian crossing safety issue that has been presented to ULSC but they are hoping the magnitude of the response this time will encourage all councillors to be very proactive and vocal in their actions to bring change and safety to the Crookwell pedestrian crossing. We realise that ULSC does not own the part of the road that the pedestrian crossing is on and that it is funded by NSW Dept Main Roads however ULSC under instructions from its Councillors can certainly make strong representations for change. As many members of the public made known, they do not want to be waiting years for this change because a serious accident or death is inevitable.

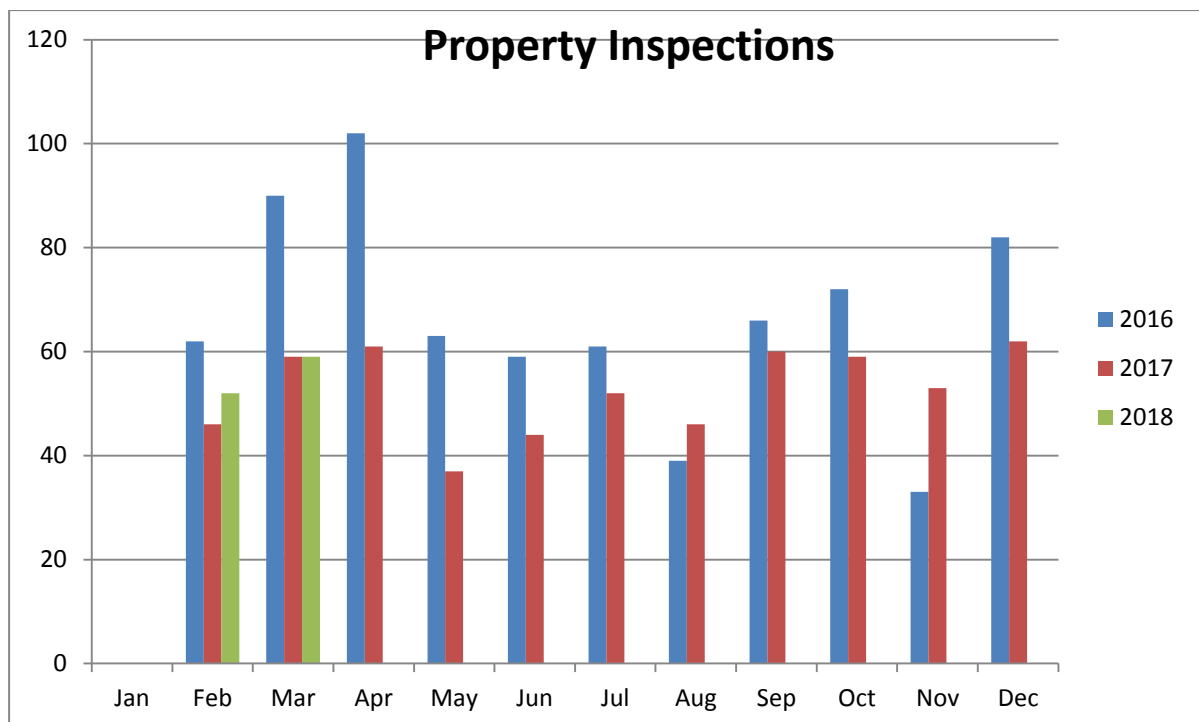
Key for Actions of Inspections

Notice – an inspection where a Weed Control Notice under section 18 of the Act will be served.

Roadside weed control work has continued to focus on woody weed control with weeds such as Blackberry, Gorse, Brooms and St John's Wort targeted. This control program will continue through until the end April 2018.

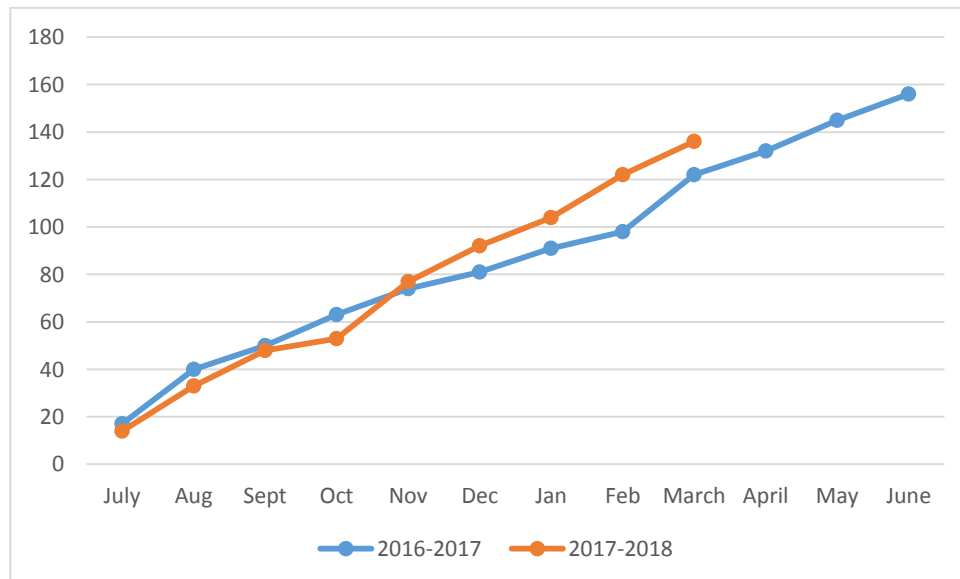

Council will continue to prioritise risk and safety related requests within the available budget until the end of the current financial year (2017/18). This will result in a reduced amount of routine maintenance on Local and Regional Roads, however essential maintenance to mitigate risk on hazardous situations will be undertaken on an as needs basis determined by supervisory staff.

POLICY IMPACT

As a result of the road maintenance expenditure only essential maintenance to mitigate risk on hazardous situations will be undertaken on an as needs basis. This may result in some maintenance activities being postponed outside current response times.

Staff will inform customers of the outcome of their request to ensure the community is informed of the works that will be completed in a timely manner or works that will be postponed to the 2018/2019 year.

ISSUE

This report advises Council regarding the activities of the technical and managerial staff of the Works and Operations Department during the previous month.

RECOMMENDATION That -

1. Council receive the report and note the information.

BACKGROUND

This report is intended to provide a brief update on activities currently underway and an account of the activities of staff and provides a record of accountability.

REPORT

Works and Operations is focussing on the following key Operational themes for the next 12 to 18 months:

1. **Asset Management**

This work will enable Council to remain financial sustainable for now and into the future with regards to the delivery of infrastructure assets services.

Council is considering the development of an Asset Management system aimed at enabling Council to make evidence based transparent decisions. The initial goal is to prepare a first cut of the Asset Management Plan for Upper Lachlan Shire Council towards the end of the year. A business case is developed to resource proposed vehicle and machinery. This proposed vehicles and machinery is required to prepare Asset Register. This Asset Register is intended to be used for preparation of the Asset Management Plan(s). An Asset Steering Committee is being considered to coordinate Asset Management activities across the Council.

2. **Delivery of Projects and Works**

This work is intended to minimise the likelihood of cost overruns on projects, ensure clarity of scope of works being delivered and bridge the gap between the promised and actual date of delivery of projects.

Currently under trial and scheduled to start July 2018, projects are intended to be delivered through Project Control Groups (PCG), where scope will be developed in accordance with Needs and Requirements. This Needs and Requirements will

be used to develop Concept Designs, Preliminary Designs and Detailed Designs. Costs and schedules will be continually updated along with the development of the scope to ensure appropriate decisions can be made about the value for money using Value Engineering.

For routine services, the work includes the development of Annual and Weekly forward programs scheduled to be rolled out in July 2018 to be made available to the community after the current trial run. These forward programs will help measure performance, provide forward construction planning and systematic allocation of resources to deliver agreed service levels within the available budget. Additionally, the current projects are being scoped using Systems Engineering, Value Engineering and Project Management principles in accordance with industry standards consistent with ISO. It is envisaged the first impact of these works will be visible within the new financial year (18/19) and major portion of this work will be visible to the community within 2 years' time.

3. Realignment of resources

In order to deliver Asset Management and Project outcomes the resources of the organisation are being realigned. This means, ensuring adequate resources are allocated with regards to current and future needs of the organisation to ensure sustainability of the service levels to the community within the agreed time frames and quality outcomes.

Major Activities within the last 3 months

- East Street, Crookwell NSW – Council has received further correspondence, however there is no need to revise the adopted strategy resolved by Council last year.
- Taradale Road – Further correspondence has been received and Council is responding to these requests in accordance with the strategy adopted by Council last year.
- On 15 February 2018, Council staff discussed the initial findings on the internal audit into procurement and accounts payable.
- On 16 February 2018, Council staff met representatives of the Gunning Showground Committee and discussed ways to work together.
- On 20 February 2018 Council outdoor staff met in Crookwell and Gunning Depot to discuss the routine implementation of Council resolutions.
- On 20 February 2018, Council staff met to review the CRM categories for implementation as a part of the CRM software roll out.
- On 22 February 2018 Council reviewed expenditures to date and agreed to consider reducing service levels for the remainder of the year in order to remain within the allocated budget.
- On the 22 February 2018 Council's Local Traffic Committee met to discuss traffic issues within the Upper Lachlan Shire Council and to recommended to Council the implementation of the proposed measures.

WORKS IN PROGRESS - TECHNICAL & MANAGERIAL cont'd

- On 23 February 2018 Council staff met with the representatives of Crookwell 2 Windfarm and discussed the use of heavy vehicle access and upgrade to the Woodhouselee Road North and South. Council has revoked the heavy vehicle (OSOM only) permits for the time being until repairs to a small section of Woodhouselee Road are complete.
- On 2 March 2018 Council staff met EPA regarding future compliance of Council facilities. General concerns were raised and Council has received specific concerns on 5 April 2018. Council is preparing a response to these concerns and will submit a separate report to the Council on this subject during the May 2018 Council meeting.
- On 6 March 2018 Council Streetscape Project Control Group met to discuss the outsourcing of the design documentation as a part of the Streetscape upgrade project. The quotes were advertised and closed in April 2018 and a successful entity will be appointed shortly.
- On 9 March 2018 Council's staff met SES representatives regarding the upgrades to the SES Unit in Collector NSW. A submission has been received from SES requesting toilet facilities within their building. The initial feedback suggests, such addition of toilet facilities within a flood zone is not permitted and detailed advice is awaited. SES is scouting for possible new sites within the township of Collector.
- On 19 March 2018 Council's new Project Delivery Engineer started work focussing on Crookwell Memorial Upgrade, Kiama Creek, Pat Cullen Reserve, Abercrombie Bridge upgrade and other projects. The position will also focus on systematic development of project scopes using Systems Engineering and Value Engineering in accordance with the themes to address Council's issues with delivery times and cost over runs.
- On 20 March 2018 Council staff reviewed the budget of Clifton Park and used this project to test the new project management methodologies.
- On 23 March 2018 Council staff attended CBRJO. During the meeting, it was agreed to consider the setting up of a Regional Project Management Office for the delivery of projects outside the routine works of each of the member Councils.
- On 26 March 2018, Council staff considered the evaluation of resources required to meet EPA expectations and meet current and future needs of the Swimming pool, Water, Sewer and Waste function of the Council and agreed to develop a Resource Plan.
- On 28 March 2018 Council staff attended the Access Committee meeting. The committee agreed to accept relocating the existing Disability Parking Space in Roberts Street Crookwell across the road next to the JD Hardware Store.
- On 29 March 2018 staff concluded commercial negotiation regarding the purchase of a new Water Truck as resolved by Council. The agreed amount for the purchase is \$273,454 (Ex GST) which is less than the tendered amount providing a higher powered truck supporting Council's Operations. This agreed amount is less than the available budget providing savings of over \$7,000.

- On 3 April 2018 Council received a copy of the letter from NSW National Parks advising the approval of proposed works located at Abercrombie Bridge as a part of the proposed project. The License to commence works is yet to be issued pending the further development of the design and tendering out of works.
- On 3 April 2018 Council staff approved the final draft of the letter to be sent to the neighbouring property owners at the Crookwell Landfill facility as a part of the commercial negotiation. The final letter is expected to be sent shortly.
- On the 4 April 2018, Councillor Searl and staff met the Grabben Gullen Progress Association and discussed how they can put in requests for assistance.
- In April 2018, tendered quotes for the design of Streetscape upgrade works have now closed and will be reviewed shortly for the appointment of the successful contractor.

POLICY IMPACT

It is recommended that all Customer Requests are referred to the Council directly via email, phone, or letter. In the absence of a response within 15 days, these requests can be escalated. Safety issues must be marked appropriately in order to prioritise works.

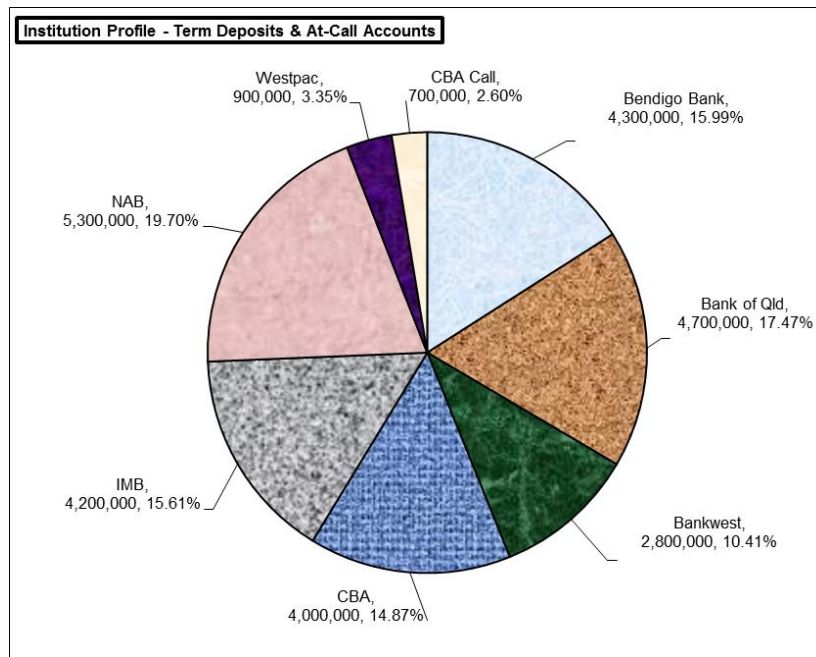

INVESTMENTS FINANCIAL INSTITUTION PROFILE AS AT 31 MARCH 2018

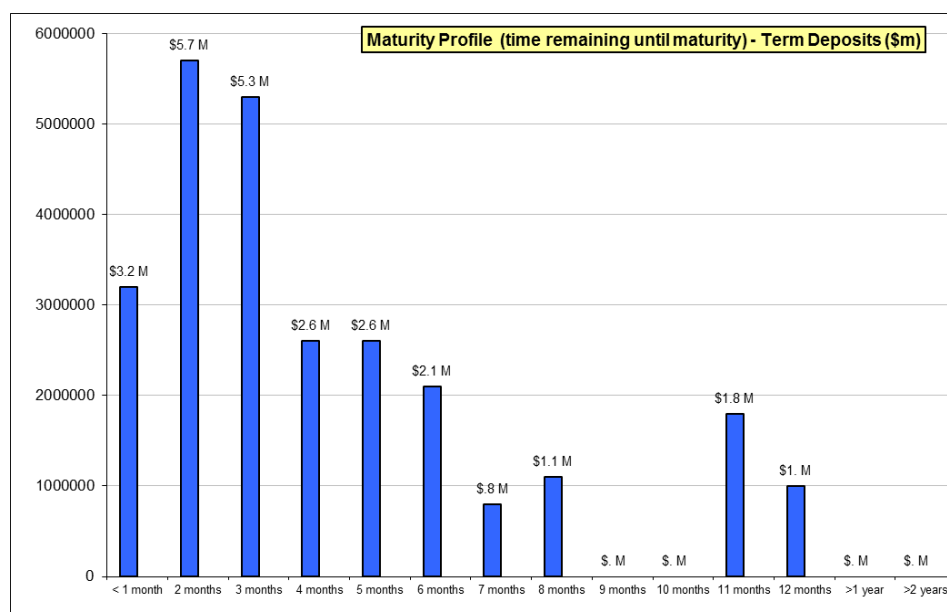

OVERVIEW:

The libraries experienced a busy quarter with consistent usage across all areas. Crookwell Library staff catalogued new library material replacing some of the items damaged in last year's storm. During the quarter a number of promotional events were held in our Libraries attracting a number of attendees who also used the library services. These events included the Crookwell Friends of the Library AGM, Food cents workshop, and an author talk by Matthew Geddes at the Crookwell Library. Whilst at the Gunning Library events included Food cents workshop, History of the Safety razor talk, and an Indigenous culture school holiday workshop. The regular activities of scrabble, knitting, and Storytime continue to be well attended.

EVENTS AND PROMOTION:

Crookwell and Gunning Libraries:

- Promotional media were published in the Crookwell Gazette, the Gunning Lions Newsletter, Goulburn's 2GN, Goulburn Post, Crookwell Library Facebook site, Council Website, the Voice, Gunning Library Activities' regular column in the Gunning Lions Newsletter, and regular information on Council's Information page in the Crookwell Gazette. Articles included 'Library Lover's Day'; Sports talk by author at Library'; and 'What's on'.
- Displays showcasing a selection of fiction and non-fiction items from the libraries were displayed in prominent areas of the library. These items provided an interesting variety of items for loan with a different theme and show the breadth of items in the collections. The Crookwell Library displayed items on the theme of Australia Day; heroes and villains; Whodunit; love letters for Library Lover's Day; Gothic: the dark side; health and fitness; and blue books. Gunning Library displayed items on Aboriginal Information and Arts; Australia Day; Women Making a Difference; Australian memories; Valentine's Day; blue books; all talk; cats; drawing/art; books with bite; children's cooking and craft. Patrons borrowed from these different themed displays and discovered a range of interesting items from the collections. Both libraries displayed new items acquired in a separate new book display.

Gunning:

- This quarter twenty-two people attended the knitting circle. There was no knitting circle held in January.
- Gunning Library held a History of the Safety razor talk on Saturday the 24th March. Ten people attended this event.
- The Gunning Library held a Food cents workshop and LiFE falls prevention registration on Wednesday the 28 March from 2-4:30pm, facilitated by Grand Pacific Health in Goulburn. Seven people attended this event.

Crookwell:

- Twenty-one people attended the monthly scrabble afternoons. The Crookwell Library Friends continue to run the session and sponsor afternoon tea. There was no scrabble held in January.
- The Crookwell Friends of the Library held their AGM on Friday the 9 March from in the Crookwell Library. Eleven people attended the AGM. Following the AGM there was a thank you morning tea for the library volunteers. Twelve people attended the morning tea.
- The Crookwell Library held a Food cents workshop on Friday the 2 March facilitated by Grand Pacific Health in Goulburn. Ten people attended this event.
- Local author Matthew Geddes gave a talk about sport and his weekly sports segment on 2GN, on Tuesday the 6 March in the Crookwell Library. Six people attended this event.

- Crookwell Library's kitchen facilities are well used by visitors and library members for quite reading and catch-ups. This quarter six people used the facilities to have a catch-up after a funeral on Tuesday the 6 February.

CHILDREN AND YOUNG PEOPLE:

Gunning:

- Fortnightly Storytime continues to be popular, with the Gunning Early Child Centre joining the Storytime sessions. Storytime resumed for the year in February. In this quarter there were a total of one hundred and nine children who attended Storytime.
- Gunning and District Before and After School Care – OOSH continue to use the computers after school when computers are available. Gunning OOSH after school care utilised the library after school on Wednesday the 21 March. Eight people came with this group.
- Gunning Library held a School Holiday Workshop in conjunction with Gunning District Landcare and Thunderstone Aboriginal Cultural Services on Indigenous culture on Friday 19 January. Twenty children participated in the activity, with seven volunteers assisting. Some creative animals were made with raffia, hay and coloured wool. A demonstration on how to play the Digeridoo and dance sticks was enjoyed by all. Thank you to Landcare who sponsored this activity.
- Gunning Library held a School Holiday Workshop on making your own Board Game on Tuesday the 23 January. One child participated in the program.

Crookwell:

- Crookwell and Gunning Libraries held the Summer Reading Club from 1 December to 31 January. The theme for 2018 was Game On, celebrating our Aussie sporting culture, games, technology, team spirit and the 2018 Commonwealth Games. Participants in the program received a themed activity pack. This year twenty-four children participated at the Crookwell Library and seven children at Gunning Library. There were seven pre-school, twenty primary school and six high school students participating in the reading club. The participants read four hundred and eleven books read over summer. Each child received a certificate for participation in the program.
- Weekly Storytime continues to be popular. Storytime resumed for the year in February, with SDN returning for sessions from March. In this quarter there were a total of one hundred and forty children who attended Storytime.
- OOSH School Holiday Care visited the Crookwell Library on Monday the 15 January. Eight people visited the library in this group. The children spent the time reading, dressing-up in the animal costumes, and colouring-in and playing card games around the kid's game activity table in the kitchen area.
- The Crookwell Early Learning Centre visited the Crookwell Library on Monday the 22 January. Twenty people visited the library in this group. The Centre has joined as a library member and will be visiting the library when they can on Monday mornings for a story and craft activity.

- The Crookwell Early Learning Centre visited the Crookwell Library on Monday the 12 February for a story and craft activity. Eighteen people visited the library in this group.
- Crookwell Library held a School Holiday Workshop on creating a Dotty fireworks mural on Tuesday 23 January. Three children participated in the program.
- Several children during the school holidays played games, completed puzzles and did some colouring-in around the kid's game activity table in the kitchen area at the Crookwell Library.

COLLECTIONS, RESOURCES AND FACILITIES:

Collections

- Library staff at Crookwell Library completed the weeding in the non-fiction collection and weeded some of the adult fiction; junior fiction and youth fiction collections.
- Library staff at Gunning weeded worn books from the collection.
- Library staff continued issuing new library cards to library members during this quarter.
- During this quarter Crookwell Library staff catalogued forty DVDs and eighty large print books which are replacing some of the damaged items from the February 2017 storm.
- Crookwell Library held a display advertising the library product RB Digital for e-audiobooks, e-books and e-magazines.
- The Crookwell Library received ten books of the same title for a book club kit from another public library. These will be covered in contact and sent to Goulburn to be added to a kit and to the pool of kits for the Read and Connect book clubs.
- Crookwell Library staff checked the book cart lists selected by Australian Library Service (ALS) library book supplier for duplicates on the library catalogue. The books were ordered at the end of March. ALS will catalogue and cover the books. So far there are seven hundred and ninety-nine books on order with another group of books still to be selected and ordered. Over the next few months the books will be added to the Crookwell Library's collection.
- Gunning and Crookwell Library staff catalogued the audiobooks received from another public library. A small senior's grant helped to pay for the audiobooks.

Resources

- This quarter, volunteers completed forty-eight hours of work in the Crookwell Library and eighteen hours at the Gunning Library.
- Volunteers helped this quarter at Crookwell Library with book displays, picking items from the daily reserve list and shelving. At Gunning Library volunteers assisted with school holiday activities and Storytime.
- In this quarter the Library Manager:

- Participated in phone meetings with book suppliers in regards to the replacement of the damaged books and end-processing of these books; gave feedback to the applicants who applied for the Request for Quotation (RFQ) for the supply of library books to replace Crookwell Library's damaged items.
- Attended several meetings on the Request for Quotation (RFQ) for library books and library end-processing with Council and Library staff. The RFQ was uploaded on Thursday the 21 December and closed on Monday the 29 January. Subsequent meetings were held in February to create the evaluation criteria, assess and finalise the RFQ submissions.
- Created book processing procedures for Australian Library Services (ALS). ALS were selected from the RFQ.
- Attended the Crookwell Memorial Hall Committee quarterly meeting at the Crookwell Library on Thursday 22 February.
- Attended the South East Zone Library Manager's Meeting in Bowral on Friday the 23 February.
- Attended a meeting with the Local Schools as Community Centres Facilitator Alan Caldwell on Thursday the 8 March to discuss the free Let's Read kits that are available to public libraries to use in their collection to promote early literacy. Let's Read encourages parents to read to their children from four months of age, so they are ready to learn to read when they reach school. Alan talked about the program and delivered twenty kits to use for both Crookwell and Gunning Libraries. There is also a Let's Count program which we could also utilise once the Let's read program is launched. The kits will be catalogued and re-housed into suitable material for borrowing.
- Attended a meeting with a representative from Bolinda BorrowBox (e-audiobooks and e-books platform) on Thursday the 8 March in the Crookwell Library.
- Attended a meeting with Brad Langoulant from e-smart Libraries on Thursday the 22 March to discuss the program.
- Compiled a list of books for the CWA Evening Branch who will be purchasing some books to replace some of the items damaged in the May rain at the Crookwell Library.
- Rebranded the Inter Library Loans return slips and the two different date due slip, adding the Upper Lachlan Shire Library Service name and Council logo, and removing references to the STLC.
- Informed staff of the changes to Copyright. New copyright notices have been put up around the public computers and the photocopiers at both Libraries. Staff were also sent a link to the State Library NSW recorded seminar so they could familiarise themselves with the changes.

- Completed online training called 'YA – Why not' on the 5 March through a three week intensive course. The Library Manager was successful in applying for a sponsored spot from the NSW State Library so there were no course fees. This course provided training on young adult spaces in libraries, young adults and technology, and what young adults like to read.
- Updated the Storytime brochure and provided some to the Crookwell Child Health and Immunisation Nurse for promoting to families.

Facilities

- The libraries computers and Wi-Fi facilities continue to be well used by patrons and people passing through.
- The network cupboard for the Crookwell Library was installed on 29 January.
- Four new computers were purchased for Crookwell and Gunning Libraries (three for Crookwell, one for Gunning). The new computers have been installed.
- Four PCs at Gunning Library were taken away and repaired by Council's IT Systems Officer. Three PCs were repaired on site.
- Gunning Library changed from a residential plan to a business plan with Telstra. This completes the changeover for both libraries. The Library Service will be receiving subsidised fees through the State Library NSW NSW.Net Service. The changeover has not only reduced the costs but has substantially increased our Internet speeds.
- There were new water stains and water dripping through the ceiling to the Lino in the kitchen area in the Crookwell Library in January and February. Council's Building Maintenance Supervisor has been notified about the changes. Some repairs have been undertaken.
- The flag pole at Gunning Library was removed in this quarter as it posed a risk to public safety and to the Gunning Library building.
- The air conditioning units at Crookwell and Gunning Libraries were serviced in this quarter.

SUMMARY REPORT

This matter is reported to Council because notification of the application attracted one submission from the public, request for variation to Council's DCP for on-site car parking and request for reduction in Section 7.11 contributions and for a Voluntary Planning Agreement.

Development Application 133/2017 proposes the demolition of buildings and works and construction of a Mixed Use Development comprising a medical centre, commercial premises and on-site car parking. A copy of the development drawings is attached as Attachment 1.

The development has been considered with regard to the relevant provisions of applicable environmental planning instruments, development control plan and Council policies.

The attached Section 4.15 evaluation report (Attachment 2) details consideration of the above.

The application was notified and advertised for public comment. In response one submission was received. The submission supports the proposed restoration of the old

fire station premises and has been addressed in the attached Section 4.15 Evaluation report.

The application proposes a variation to on-site car parking requirements which has been assessed and supported for the proposed development.

The applicant has requested a reduction in Section 7.11 and Section 64 Contributions, the consideration of a Voluntary Planning Agreement and an off-set of contributions through physical works arising from the development.

The applicable contributions for the development are \$57,235 for roads and plan administration and \$8,511 for water and sewerage. These contributions have been assessed under Council's existing contribution and servicing plans and include credits for the previous use of the site as a fire station.

The applicant has not requested deferral of contributions or provided a detailed submission that provides an alternative assessment of contributions.

The request for a Voluntary Planning Agreement has been considered and does not provide any benefit to Council or the development which is not a multi-staged proposal.

The proposal for off-setting of the cost of works in Goulburn Street, being the provision of one accessible car parking space and partial kerb and guttering restoration, are works directly attributable to the impact of the development and variations to on-site car parking. These are not considered to be an off-set item.
